12	<u>(5)</u>	an inmate who is intoxicated by alcohol or drug use as determined at intake by one of the following:	
13		(A) a blood alcohol content level of .15 or greater as measured;	
14		(B) use of slurred speech; or	
15		(C) the inability to control body movement.	
16	(d) Officers shall A jail shall make sure that officers remain awake at all times. times while on duty.		
17	(e) Officers shall not be assigned other duties that would interfere with the continuous supervision, custody or control		
18	of inmates. When an officer is assigned to supervise inmates as required by Paragraph (a), (b), and (c) of this Rule, a		
19	jail shall not assi	gn the officer other tasks that would interfere with the supervision of inmates. These other tasks shall

28	(f) Female A jai	l shall have female officers shall be on duty when female inmates are confined.	
29	(g) The sheriff o	r the administrator of the regional jail <u>administrator</u> shall develop a contingency <u>personnel</u> <u>plan</u> <u>plans</u>	
30	for the supervision and control of inmates during an emergency, and that plan a fire, an emergency event, or an		
31	emergency situation that includes rioting, bomb threats, escapes, and the taking of hostages. The contingency		
32	personnel plans shall provide for the ready availability of extra personnel. A contingency personnel plan shall be		
33	included in the emergency plans required by Rule .0203(18) of this Subchapter and the disaster plan required by Rule		
34	.0403(d) of this Subchapter.		
35	(h) Inmates A jail shall not be allowed allow an inmate to supervise or assume any control over other inmates.
